| _h_ Request for Information | a. demands a rising (but not counted) vote after a voice vote |
| _o_ Amend | b. places a limit on the time or number of speakers |
| _j_ Parliamentary Inquiry | c. allows a matter to be sent to a smaller group to consider and report back |
| _a_ Division of the Assembly | d. “kills” main motion |
| _n_ Rescind/Amend Something Previously Adopted | e. delays consideration of a matter |
| _i_ Point of Order | f. ends debate immediately |
| _q_ Adjourn | g. permits a short break |
| _g_ Recess | h. allows a member to ask a question relevant to business (but not procedure) |
| _f_ Previous Question | i. calls attention to an error in procedure |
| _k_ Table | j. allows a member to ask a procedural question |
| _p_ Appeal | k. temporarily delays a matter when something of urgency arises |
| _d_ Postpone Indefinitely | l. brings business before the assembly; permitted only when no other motion is pending |
| _c_ Refer | m. revisit motion already voted on at same meeting |
| _e_ Postpone | n. strikes or modifies motion adopted at prior meeting |
| _b_ Limit/Extend Debate | o. allows modification to another motion by adding, deleting, or changing words |
| _m_ Reconsider | p. takes decision from chair and gives to assembly |
| _l_ Main Motion | q. ends the meeting |
